CHEYENNE MOUNTAIN ZOO'S DOG CHECKLIST

By bringing your dog to the Zoo today, you are in agreement with the following checklist:

- My dog will be under my control at all times.
- My dog has an up-to-date rabies vaccination.
- My dog will be on a non-retractable, no more than 6', leash at all times.
- ☐ My dog and I will stay on Zoo paths at all times, in non-restricted areas. (See map for restricted areas.)
- ☐ I will clean up after my dog and ensure it gets proper hydration.
- ☐ I will not allow my dog to have contact with any Zoo animal, or act in a way that agitates Zoo animals or other guests/dogs.
- ☐ I understand that if I am asked to leave for not following these requirements, I am not eligible for a refund.

Your dogs give Zoo animals novel opportunities to flex instincts, like protection, predation or pure curiosity.

Throughout your visit, take notice of how different species react. We've seen lemurs and meerkats strengthen their bonds by 'protecting their territory,' mountain lions stalking and gorillas watching calmly.

ADVENTURING WITH YOUR DOG IN THE ZOO

This is a very stimulating environment for your dog, and they're counting on you to help them enjoy it. If you see excessive panting, barking, or shaking, your dog might need a break. Remember, the best way to stop a dog from barking is to keep walking.

Keep those pups hydrated, handled, and happy, and have a wonderful Dog Day at CMZoo!

Dogs are restricted from certain areas for quest and animal safety (see map).

Humans who are unable to keep dogs under calm control or need to be addressed by staff repeatedly may be asked to leave the Zoo without a refund.

If Zoo animals appear aggressive or agitated because of a dog's presence or behavior, we'll ask that dog and its human to move on.

WATER / WASTE / LEASHES

- Water bowls will be available throughout the Zoo (see map for bowl locations).
- Please use outdoor bear-proof trash receptacles to dispose of your dog's waste.
- · Leashes must be no longer than 6 feet, and non-retractable. Leashes must be attached at all times, even if the dog is in a carrier or stroller.

RESTRICTED AREA (DOGS NOT ALLOWED)

Some animals can strongly react to the presence of an animal outside of their enclosure. For the safety of you, your dog, and our animal collection, certain areas are restricted. Please see the map inside this guide.

Included in these restricted areas are places where Zoo animals can choose to freely roam among quests, or areas where there is potential for contact. Attractions and rides are restricted as well.
