Mountain Tapir: IUCN - Endangered

Tapir anecdotes:

- only 2 zoos in the USA keep mountain tapirs: CMZ and LA Zoo only 6 in human care (LA zoo houses 5)
- Mtn Tapirs are the most endangered of the 5 tapir species numbers are declining due to illegal hunting, loss of habitat to human dwellings and crops. Current estimates indicate about 2500 in the wild
- Carlotta was the oldest Mtn Tapir in the USA before she recently passed she last gave birth in 2003. Cofan came to CMZ after 2003 in an effort to breed Carlotta - but it did not occur.
- Cofan enjoys water
- Cofan had a kidney removed in Feb 2021 and is doing well. Anatomy is very similiar to

horses. Closest "relatives" are rhinos and horses.

- Cofan does voluntary e-rays, blood work, ultrasounds. Chin scratches is his best reward.
- Cofan is nicknamed the "labrador of the zoo" due to his friendly, easy-going personality.
 He enjoys chin scratches and armpit scratches and goes into "tapir trance" when scratched.
- several CMZ keepers have gone to Equador in 2018, 2019 and 2020 to track and collar Mtn Tapirs with the Andean Bear Foundation. Carlotta (CMZ tapir now deceased) was helpful in trying out one of the collars used in the study to make sure it fit well around her neck. For more info read the article in the April 2018 Waterhole.
- the CMZ has supported Tapir conservation programs and recent support has provided local organizations with dart guns and educational materials for local school children
