Field Trip Updates

Hello Docent Friends. On Thursday, November 10, five docents went to Florence, CO to see Nature's
Educators
Devin Jaffe spent two hours teaching us about raptors and Falconry. We learned so much! For example, falconers are not people who handle raptors, they are people who hunt with raptors. Devin is one of four Master Falconers in Colorado and has been doing this for over 20 years. We saw a Harris Hawk, a Ferruginous Hawk, a Great Horned Owl, Golden Eagle and a Red Front Macaw. Harris Hawks are also known as the wolves of the sky because they hunt in packs. Also, the difference between hawks and eagles is the size of their talons. It was a wonderful trip and finished up with lunch at Oak Creek Tavern in Florence.

The next field trip is to San Diego, CA, Feb 5-9, 2023. Sunday, Feb 5 fly into San Diego (or drive if you want a road trip). Monday, Feb 6 is a trip to the San Diego Zoo. Tuesday, Feb 7 is a trip to the Safari Park and SeaWorld. Wednesday, Feb 8 is a trip to Lion, Tigers and Bears Sanctuary (a two-hour guided visit of our scenic sanctuary and historic ranch where you will get to meet the exotic animals and big cats and learn their heartwarming rescue stories - \$38.00 donation) and the Japanese Friendship Gardens. Thursday, Feb 9 fly home. There are currently 10 docents committed or interested in the trip; if we have 15 in our group we get a 10% discount on the entry fees for the zoo. Please join us! It will be a fun time to be in a warm place.

The last two field trips of the year are A MONDAY IN MARCH 2023: CSU Spur, Denver. A day at CSU Spur has something for all ages – it's a laboratory, veterinary clinic, market, museum, art studio, classroom, garden, innovation center...all in one! 1.5 hour free tour. https://csuspur.org/ - LUNCH after for those that want to go.

The last field trip of the year will be the **First or Second Monday in May 2023: Bird Migration Identification at Cheyenne Mountain State Park, Colorado Springs.**Learn about birds that migrate to and through the state park. 8 am, 1.5-2 hours on hiking trails with ranger. \$9 per car or free with State Parks Parking Pass. After exiting the state park, we'll travel a mile south on Hwy 115 to **May Natural History Museum,** Colorado Springs' premier bug museum! The museum houses one of the largest private displays of tropical bugs in the world – 7,000 insects – that's a lot of bugs! 
