
Starting October 24, all local 719 phone numbers must be dialed using all 10 digits. A "1" is not needed in front of the 719 unless dialing outside the C/S metro area

Linking Your King Soopers Card

In order for the Auxiliary to receive the rewards from your purchases at King Soopers, your card has to be linked to the Auxiliary's community rewards program.

This change does not affect your gas card points.

If you already have a King Soopers account:

- Go to the King Soopers official site www.kingsoopers.com
- Click on My Account
- Put in your password
- On the left side of the screen, click Community Rewards
- Search for Cheyenne Mountain Zoo Auxiliary or our organization number which is: BC371 (either of these will work)
- When search comes up, click Enroll (if you don't go down and click on enroll it won't link your account to the Auxiliary's rewards)

If you don't already have a King Soopers' account but have a loyalty card, these are the instructions to create an account:

- Go to the King Soopers' official site www.kingsoopers.com
- Click on Welcome/Sign-in pull-down
- Click Sign in
- At the bottom of the page on the left, click Create an Account. You will need an email address to create an account.
- Create a password for this account
- Enter the number of your loyalty card found on the reverse side of the card or if you have your phone number as an alternate ID you may use that number instead of the loyalty card number.
- Don't forget to go all the way to the bottom and click "Create an Account" located on the left side.
- Once that account has been created, then click on Community Rewards on the left side of the page
- In the search box put in Cheyenne Mountain Zoo Auxiliary or our organization number BC371 (either will work)
- When search comes up, click **Enroll** (if you don't go down and click on enroll it won't link your account to the Auxiliary's rewards)

Enrichment Drop Off Guidelines

Enrichment items for the animals at the Cheyenne Mountain Zoo are welcome and appreciated by both the animals themselves and the Zoo Staff who take care of them. There is a process that the animal management team would like all docents to follow for donating and delivering enrichment items to the Zoo. Note: the following guidelines do not apply to donating paper towel or toilet paper rolls used for enrichment items.

If you would like to donate enrichment items for our animal residents at the Zoo, please coordinate with the keepers of the Loft building or other animal/area you wish to support as to what items are needed and when they should be provided. Once you have coordinated with the respective keepers, the donated items should then either be brought to the Loft or dropped off at the Administration Building's Zookeeper entrance, specifically just inside the double doors to the left, across from where the zookeepers' radios are located. In addition, please label the donated items with the name of the area for which they are intended. The respective keepers will then pick up those donated items and take them to their areas.

Examples of these enrichment items can include clean sheets and/or towels, lunch size paper bags, cardboard boxes, spices and perfumes. Be sure to coordinate with the specific animal keeper for needed donated items BEFORE bringing them to the Zoo.


Paint Mines Field Trip
